Unfortunately we have been unable to continue the work with children on Saturdays in Limanu due to the fact that our daughters have moved to Bucharest, and Solange has a knee problem, which has severely hampered our work.

We have good news to share, and we ask for prayer from every one of you.

On March 12th this year Raquel will be getting engaged, and on August 14th (Sunday) she will be getting married to a man called Cristian Mushat. He is from the Baptist Church in Bucharest. He is an agricultural engineer with a Masters degree, and he is already working. Raquel is currently finishing her second year at the School of Architecture. They will be living in Bucharest.

Rebeca is finishing her second year at the Languages Faculty and also continues to live in Bucharest.

Jonathan, thank God, is now working in a Call Centre which is better than the one he previously worked in - his salary is a little better and his working hours more normal.

As for prayer requests, and prayers for our health, I would ask you to be praying that God would raise up another person to help us here because we have a plan to expand the work, but for this we need others to come and help us.

Finally, we pray that God will continually bless the lives of every one of you who are on your knees and holding onto the ropes.
